- 1) Starting the job search: where, when, how?
- 2) Your CV: What is the most important element (or combination of elements)? How does your CV reflect it (or them)? What were the strategies you used to discover what you needed to emphasize about your work and experience?
- 3) The interview day: tell us all about it! How did you prepare? How much information did you have ahead of time (from job search committee, the hiring institution, colleagues or other informal sources)? How was the day structured? What surprised you? What would you do differently? What did you wish you knew or had prepared ahead of time?

Panel Questions—afternoon session

- 2) Becoming a new junior faculty member: How have you gone about discovering necessary boundaries and setting them? How can you be smart about negotiating this huge job? What strategies have you found to make your work really count?

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Queen's University Faculty Panelists

Dr. Pascale Champagne, Associate Professor, Department of Civil Engineering. Dr. Champagne researches biomass conversion, recovery of higher-value chemicals from waste biomass, bioenergy and solid waste management.



Dr. Amanda Cooper finished her PhD this February and began a tenure-track faculty position as an Assistant Professor of Educational Policy and Leadership in July. She specializes in research-practice-policy relationships.



Dr. Gwynn Dujardin was 38 when she completed her PhD at Northwestern University and began her career as an Assistant Professor in English literature. Professor Dujardin teaches courses in early modern English and Renaissance literature, and specializes in the history of the English language and English education.



Dr. Trisha L. Parsons is an Assistant Professor in the School of Rehabilitation Therapy. She is a Physical Therapist with experience in cardiac rehabilitation and acute cardiac services. She is currently leading two CIHR initiatives - the Ontario Network for Better Outcomes Associated with Renal Disease (ONBOARD) and the Canadian Renal Rehabilitation Network.

Dr. Kyra Pyke, Assistant Professor, School of Kinesiology & Health Studies. Dr. Pyke's research area is cardiovascular physiology with a focus on the effects of stress and exercise on vascular function and health.



Dr. Susan Wilcox is a scholar in the field of adult and higher education, specializing in emancipatory education and transformative learning, learning-directed inquiry, and the scholarship of postsecondary teaching. She is currently Associate Professor in Gender Studies, cross-appointed to the Faculty of Education, and has an extensive background in the field of educational development.
